Aims of the Programme:

- Gain an understanding of a coaching approach and its impact on leading and learning in schools
- Develop a consistent organisational approach to leading and learning
- Learn and share practice on having focussed and structured conversations with staff
- Build on current coaching skills and behaviours
- Learn appropriate coaching models and tools and practice with them
- Have the opportunity to receive feedback on your own coaching practice

Using a coaching approach in school positively impacts a range of different relationships, behaviours and results. It can be used successfully to:

- Empower children and young people to become better learners
- Support and develop you as a teacher
- Have focused conversations that benefit and reduce pressure for both people
- Support and develop your non-teaching staff
- Improve interventions with parents
- Support your career development and CPD

Assessment:

If you'd like ILM accreditation, you can undertake some formal assessment, including 4 hours of using a coaching approach, a reflective diary (reflective interview) and a personal statement
